Welcome

What a year it's been for the Party Kit Network!

Together we've seen more people than ever celebrating without waste - from kids' birthday parties and PTA fundraisers to work BBQs and family occasions. Every shared cup and reused plate tells a story of collective action, and this year those stories reached even further.

We were featured in **The Irish Times** and **The Guardian Australia**, made our UK TV debut on **Channel 5's Shop Smart, Save Money**, and joined Australia's **Dirtgirlworld** for a live stream celebrating reuse for Plastic Free July. I was also proud to present at the first **Plastic Free Gathering UK**, while members were out in their own communities promoting the party kit concept at local events and fairs — inspiring even more people to make the switch to reuse.

We launched our new Reminder Service, helping families plan ahead for low-waste parties, and saw the rise of council-run party kit schemes across the UK and beyond. Our growing community was also recognised when we were shortlisted for the **Better Business Network's Pioneer of the Year award.**

Behind the scenes, we've welcomed two new board members, Filiz Taylan Yuzak and Natalia Celemin, added new member resources, celebrated local press successes, and been joined by new kits from around the world, including our first members in the UAE, Qatar, India and Mexico, as well as more in the US after our chat on **Upstream's Indisposable podcast**.

Thank you to everyone who's been part of this journey - hiring, lending, washing, sharing, and spreading the word.

Together, we're proving that small, local actions can add up to something truly worth celebrating.

Party Kit Network

Since 2019, the Party Kit Network has been helping people celebrate with less waste.

We're a nonprofit social enterprise bringing together hundreds of people from across the globe to make reusable tableware an easy, accessible alternative to disposables.

A party kit combines the benefits of reuse and community sharing - providing plates, cups and tableware to borrow for a celebration, then returning ready to be used again. It's a simple idea that saves time, money and waste.

Each kit is independently run by families, school PTAs, community groups, local councils, small businesses and sharing libraries.

Together we form a growing movement not just for low-waste celebrations, but for championing local community sharing.

So far, our members have prevented over 1.3 million single-use items from ending up in landfill. And with every shared cup and borrowed plate, we're proving that reuse can be joyful, practical and powerful.

Beyond the Numbers

Not every impact can be counted. While our data shows the number of single-use items saved, there are quieter changes happening too - the kind that don't fit neatly into a chart but matter just as much.

When someone borrows a party kit instead of buying disposable tableware, they're doing more than just reducing waste. They're connecting with their community, supporting local initiatives, and rethinking what it means to celebrate sustainably.

These moments build something powerful:

Community connection: Borrowing and returning a party kit brings neighbours together, creating small but meaningful interactions that strengthen local ties.

Inspiration and awareness: Every reusable cup or plate used at a party helps normalise reuse, showing that sustainability can be joyful, not a compromise.

Confidence in action: Many kit owners tell us running a kit has boosted their confidence, introduced them to like-minded people, and opened doors to new opportunities.

These are the stories behind the statistics - the ripple effects that can't be measured but shape the lasting impact of our movement.

Celebrating Our Members

The Party Kit Network is made up of our amazing members, each taking action in their own community to help people celebrate without the waste. Across multiple countries, there are 618 pins on our map, with each pin representing access to a party kit. Together, our members have already kept over 1.3 million single-use items out of landfill.

Every kit is unique, but all share the same goal: to make a positive impact and encourage reuse. Beyond reducing waste, many kits support local causes and bring people together. Borrowing a party kit isn't just a transaction - it's a chance to meet neighbours, connect with like-minded people, and share a little party sparkle every time a kit gets used.

In Northampton, UK, Joely runs her party kit from home – the most common model across the network. After borrowing a kit for her daughter's birthday, she realised how easy it could be to start one herself. Joining the Party Kit Network earlier this year, she used our guides and templates to build her kit gradually and promoted it through her local nursery and social media. As a new member, Joely's kit has already helped families celebrate while avoiding hundreds of single-use items, showing how small actions add up. She received one of our Rising Star Awards this year.

Ruth Watson, Eco Connect North East CIC

In Teesside, UK, Ruth created Pass The Party, a payit-forward scheme that lends reusable party kits for free to families who might not otherwise afford them. Supported by donations from the community and local businesses, each booking includes tableware, decorations, and even reusable invitations. Ruth also partners with schools and family hubs to make celebrations more inclusive, combining environmental impact with community care. She received one of our Super Star Awards this year for being one of the top kits for avoiding waste.

City of Santa Cruz Council

In Santa Cruz, USA, the local government's waste reduction team has launched ten community kits hosted by their existing volunteer network. The kits are free to borrow, funded by the council, and promoted through city channels. Each host manages bookings and handovers with council support. This initiative shows what's possible when councils back community reuse – practical impact, low cost, and high visibility. The City of Santa Cruz also received a Super Star Award.




Financial Summary

In 2024–25, we generated an **income of almost £2,800** and **spent £2,600** with £1,052 spent on the purchase of new equipment (capital assets). Overall our expenses remain low because everyone who works on the Network donates their time, and we benefit from some gifted or discounted services.

Membership in the Party Kit Network remains free - we don't charge a joining fee or take commissions from referrals. Income from Party Kit Winchester (the only party kit owned and operated directly by the Network) continues to be our largest single source of revenue. This year we invested in materials to add book party bags to Party Kit Winchester.

This year, we received our first small grant of £825 from Winchester City Council, which helped fund the equipment for a new party kit for adults. This kit has already reduced single-use waste in our community, provided vital income to support our work at a network level, and has been used at street parties, work BBQs, family events, and PTA fundraisers.

We continue to achieve a lot with very little, but there is much more we'd love to do. Securing long-term funding will be crucial over the next few years to grow the network, support members, and extend our impact.



What's Next...

In 2025-26, we'll continue to grow the network and strengthen the movement for reuse focusing on three key priorities:

Supporting Our Members

We'll keep developing the tools and resources that help our members set up, grow and share their party kits. Our focus this year is on helping members get out into their communities to build awareness locally and get kits used more often.

We'll add new resources to the members' area, create more chances to connect and learn together, and explore new ways to strengthen our community.

Championing Reuse

We'll keep promoting the party kit concept and the wider benefits of reuse, showing that waste-free celebrations are joyful, practical and possible everywhere.

This means continuing to share inspiring stories, speak at sector events, and collaborate with partners to reach new audiences.

We'll also focus on improving the experience for people borrowing kits, making it easier than ever to celebrate sustainably.

Building Financial Resilience

The network is currently powered entirely by volunteers, and while that community spirit remains at our heart, we want to strengthen our financial foundation so we can do more.

This year we'll work to diversify income through new funding streams such as voluntary member contributions, digital downloads, and adding book party bags to Party Kit Winchester. More financial stability means more tools, more resources, and more opportunities for members in the years ahead.
